

Computer Applications—Mrs. Scott

7th grade students are working on a restaurant project. We will be using Excel to create an inventory spreadsheet and Access to create a database of customers. At the end of this project, students will have a business card and web site link for their restaurant.

6th grade students are working on a yard sale project that using all the Microsoft programs. Students will create an Excel spreadsheet of items being sold at their yard sale, and a database of 10 people they would like to invite. Invitations will be made in Publisher and a letter will be composed in Word. Students will also use Word to create a map to their yard

 8^{th} grade students will begin a unit on business foundations. We will be discussing the basics of entrepreneurship, marketing, finance, accounting and business law. **All classes are still using Edutype for touch type keyboarding. Industrial Technology—Mr. Spinks

During the next few weeks in Technology Education Students will be working on completing their module topic. In the Technology Education program students will continue working on technologies such as Aerospace, Aerodynamics, Aviation, Computer Animation, Bridge Building, Graphic Arts, Digital-Photography, Computer Aided Drafting, Flight Simulation, Co-2 - Race Car- Designs. Also over the next few weeks we will focus on subject matter that allows students to interact with computer applications and hands on activities.



Physical Education

Parker- We will be finishing our Team Handball unit the week of Nov. 28- Dec. 2. We will have a performance based test (skills) and a written test for this unit. We will then enter our final unit of the nine weeks which will be Soccer.

Morris- Physical Education students will be learning the rules, skills, and strategies for team handball. They will be required to learn the vocabulary, pass a written test covering the rules of the games, and demonstrate proper form and technique during a skills test.

White- Physical Education students will be involved in a handball unit during the next two weeks. Students will learn skills, rules and safety to compete in this sport. Students will have both a skill and a written test at the end of this unit.
